Philadelphia’s long-standing “test” for who pays the wage tax was updated especially for the COVID 2020 tax year.

“The wage tax issue is really hot right now,” explains Karpchuk.

“If you’re a nonresident, and your employer required you to work from home [during COVID], you don’t pay the wage tax. If it’s optional that you work from home, then you still pay,” said Karpchuk. “A lot of people may get tripped up, thinking they get the refund. It’s not necessarily the case. If you weren’t mandated to stay home, then you are liable for the wage tax.”
